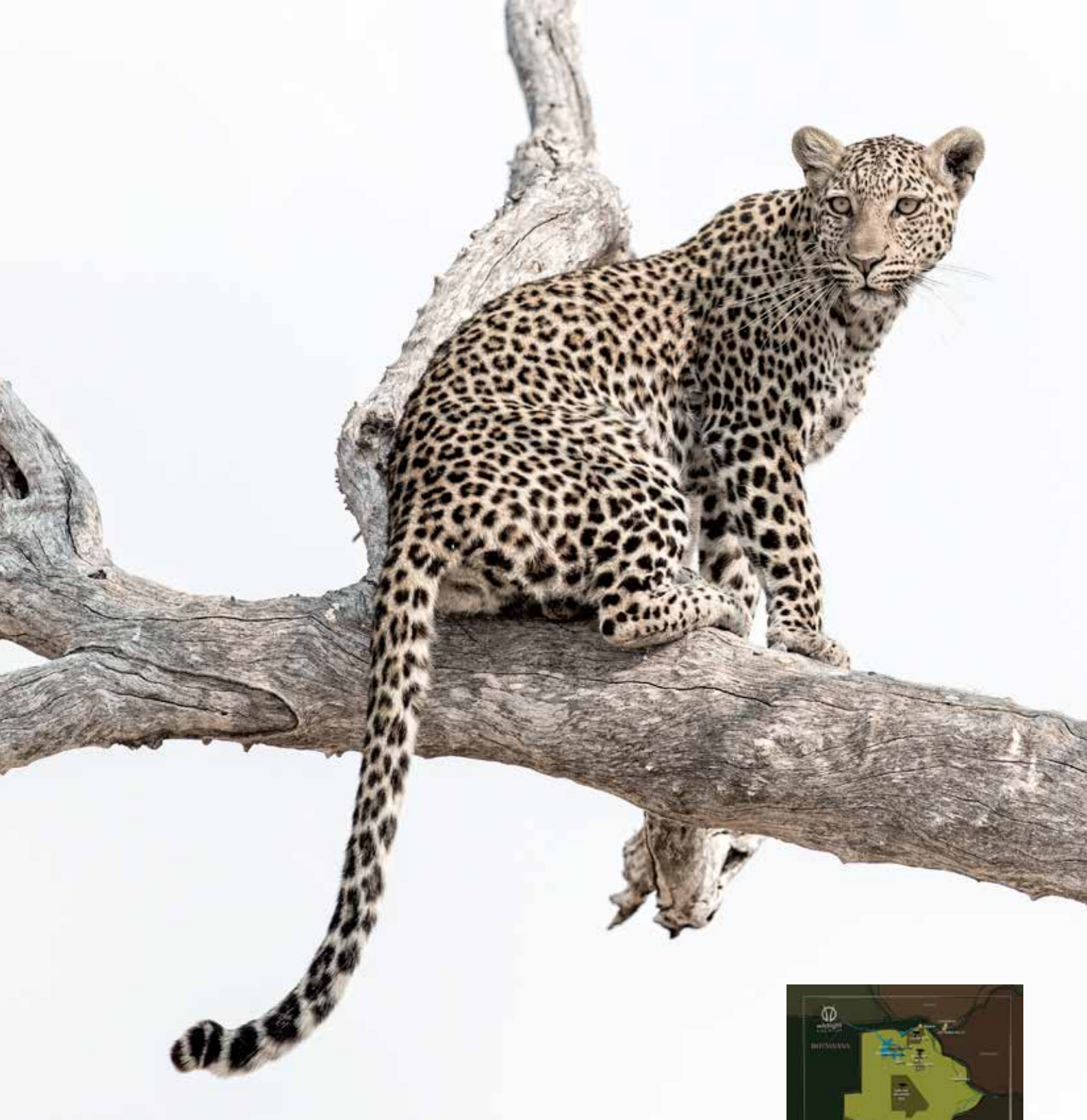

Your photographic Safari with Wildlight Safaris:

Upon arrival in Kasane - Botswana you will be met by our Wildlight Safaris representative. He will assist you with your luggage and ensure you connect with your light aircraft flight into Chobe National Park. It is approximately 40 minutes to Savute airstrip from Kasane.

Once at Savute Airstrip you will be met by Steven Stockhall and Dean Fitzpatrick, your professional photographic guides. With only a short distance from the airstrip to your exclusive mobile safari camp it's time to relax, turn your thoughts to photography and let the magical world of the Savute Marsh inspire you. Our experienced safari team will take care of everything else.

Wildlight Photographic Safaris operate with a simple philosophy: The more time spent in the field, the greater your chances are of capturing an incredible wildlife moment.

This means each safari day starts early, well and truly before first light with coffee and breakfast. Before dawn breaks you will be in the field with Steven & Dean, ready to photograph. These early hours are the perfect time for predator encounters and dramatic predator action.

Throughout the safari there is time to relax, review and recharge; this is often during the warmer parts of the day, when the light is harsh and animals are at rest. Most often we return to camp for brunch, showers, download time, and possibly a little siesta in preparation for the afternoon.

TUITION

The best place to learn about wildlife photography is in the field, with your camera in hand and your focus on the subject material. So our classrooms are huge and our lessons last all day, but our tuition style is relaxed, fun and personalised.

We will offer technical and creative advice specific to each wildlife encounter and to further develop the creativity of your Wildlife Photography, we will review your work while in camp and look at a range of post-production ideas and techniques.

We will challenge you to move out of your comfort zone, we will encourage you to try new ideas and experiment, and we will give you the tools to view wildlife photography from a new perspective.

WHAT IS A MOBILE SAFARI?

A mobile Safari involves camping 'wild' and remote within the beautiful game reserves and national parks of Botswana. But 'wild' in no way implicates you will be roughing it. Your tented accommodation will have raised beds, snug duvets & en-suite facilities and upon return from a long day in the field there will be hot showers and cold beverages available.

Delicious meals freshly prepared by our skilled camp chef will be served 3 x daily as well as snacks during your time out in the bush.

Being mobile simply means the safari camp is able to relocate from one exclusive wilderness site to another, allowing the safari to move through a variety of habitat and between the different national parks and game reserves.

While on a mobile safari elements of disturbance are minimal; there are no cell-phones, swimming pools or newspapers, and disturbance of the natural environment is also kept to a minimum as we work with environmentally friendly and sustainable operating procedures.



Savute - Chobe National Park

Remote, raw and magical, Savute continues to be a 'must see' destination for many internationally renowned wildlife photographers.

For 28 years the Savute Channel had run dry, but in 2010 with conditions perfect, flood waters once again engulfed the channel and marsh.

Savute has awoken: lush beautiful and abounding in wildlife.

The volume of bird life is beyond compare and the incredible congregation of plains game would rival any other major wildlife event on the African continent.

Savute is famous for its elephant killing lions. This event has not been documented since the BBC filmed a kill in 2007. During the 2012 Wildlight Safaris we witnessed and captured two elephant kills on successive days.

Since the flooding of the marsh in 2010, Savute has once again become a wildlife photographers Mecca.

Khwai - Okavango Delta

With its stunning panoramic views, Khwai River delineates the northern most boundary of the Moremi Game Reserve, deep within the Okavango Delta.

This year-round destination attracts healthy populations of hippo, giraffe, wildebeest, waterbuck and particularly lion, leopard and wild dogs.
