Syllabus secretary's report for 20/21 season.

The 20/21 lecture programme was finalised in early 2020 in pre-Covid times and was based on a traditional varied programme of visiting speakers plus speakers from our own Society. The growing seriousness of the pandemic and the imposition of national lock down conditions resulted in a change of plans and the programme was recast based on Zoom meetings until Christmas 2020 and then extended to cover the whole season. The outcome has been a different but rewarding experience with a varied and interesting programme successfully delivered. Twenty-three events were delivered of which 8 were led by club members. Presenters showed great skill and flexibility and quickly adapted to the new environment in which they delivered highly professional presentations.

In common with many other photographic clubs the pandemic gave the Society no option other than to adopt the use of cyber delivery. Apart from providing a lifeline, there were also other benefits from Zoom including the important ability to engage top class speakers independent of distance plus a very significant reduction in delivery costs with no accommodation or speaker expenses. The Zoom system proved resilient and quickly became well understood. The downsides were predictable in a loss of fraternity as we greeted each other through computer screens and also in presenting a more challenging speaker environment. The increase in home grown talent from our own membership who delivered excellent lectures was very heartening and bodes well for the future.

Thank you to all who supported the programme in so many different ways and to our chairman who had the task of officiating over cyberspace and handled the challenge with aplomb.
